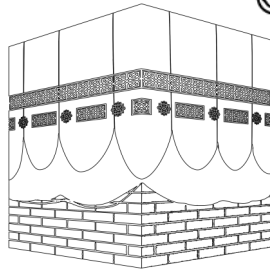


MAKKAH TO AL-QUDS

Angel Jibrael ﷺ also accompanied Prophet Muhammad ﷺ on Al Isra wal Miraj.

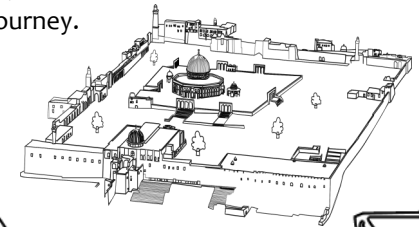

Prophet Muhammad ﷺ rode on the Buraq on his journey.



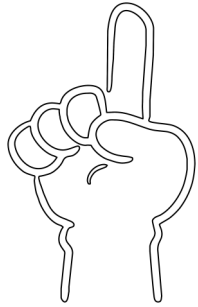
Al-Quds is also known as Jerusalem. In this special place, we have Masjid Al-Aqsa. This was the second masjid built after the Ka'bah.

Everyone has equal access to his mercy and guidance.



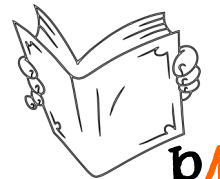
Life is a Test

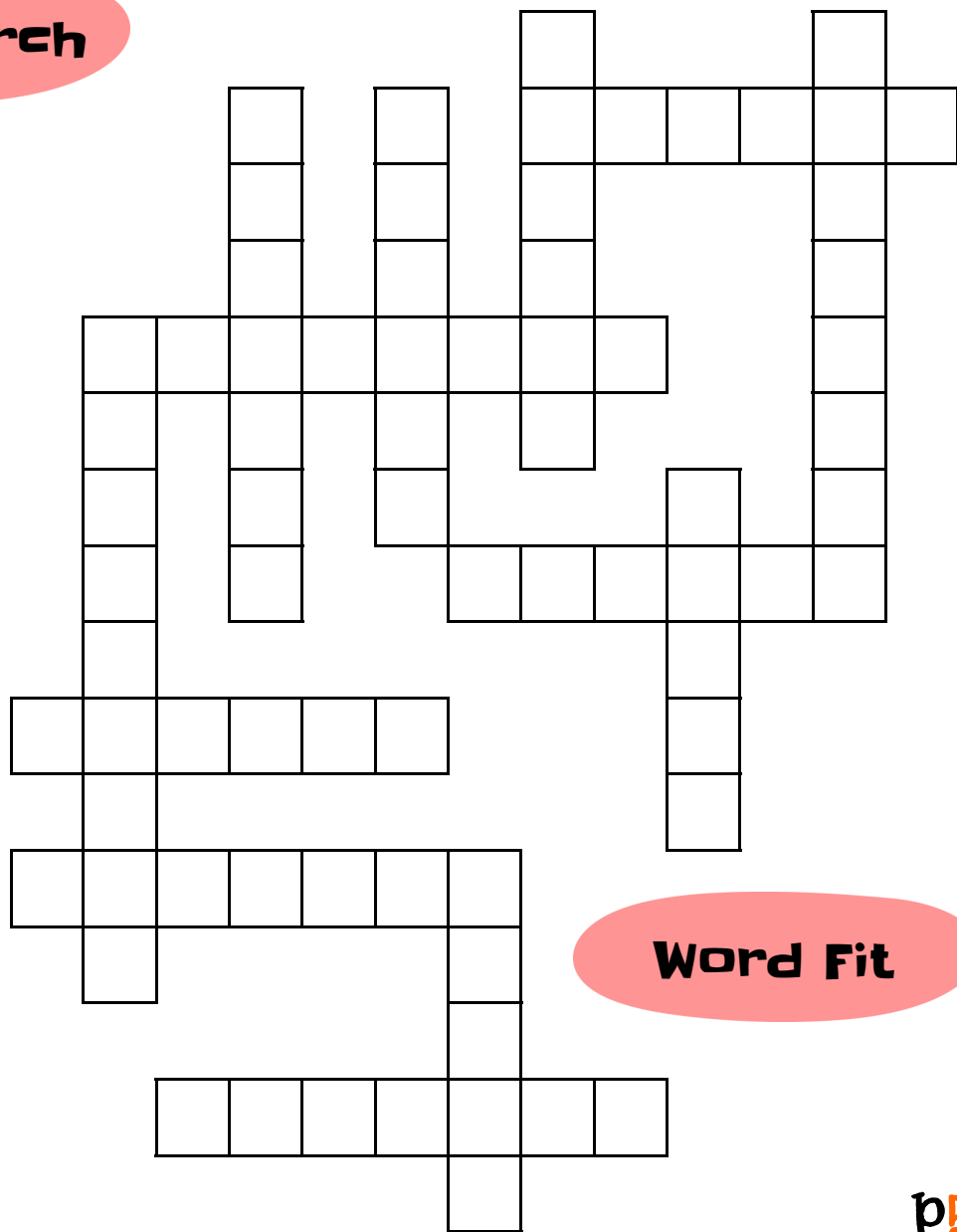

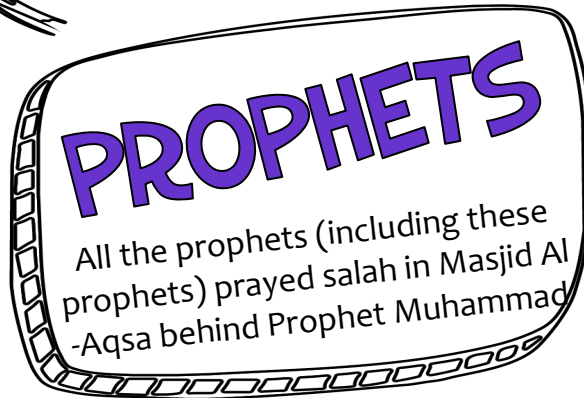
Haroon ﷺ was his brother.

Prophet Yusuf ﷺ

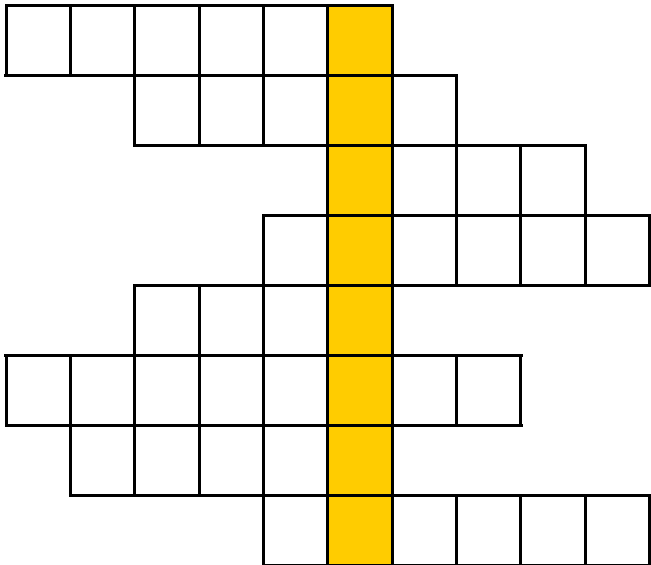
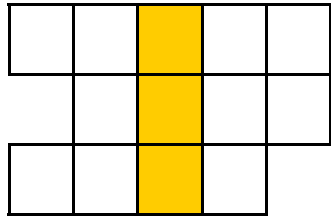
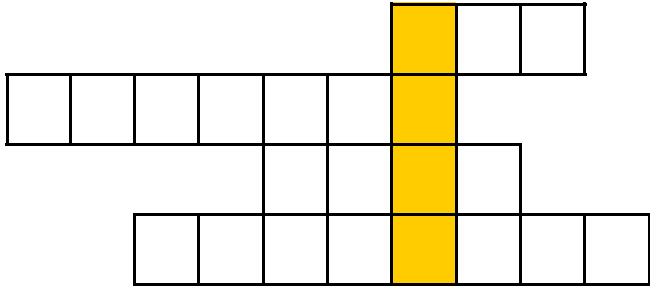

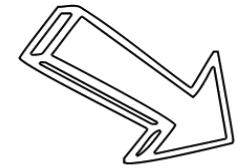
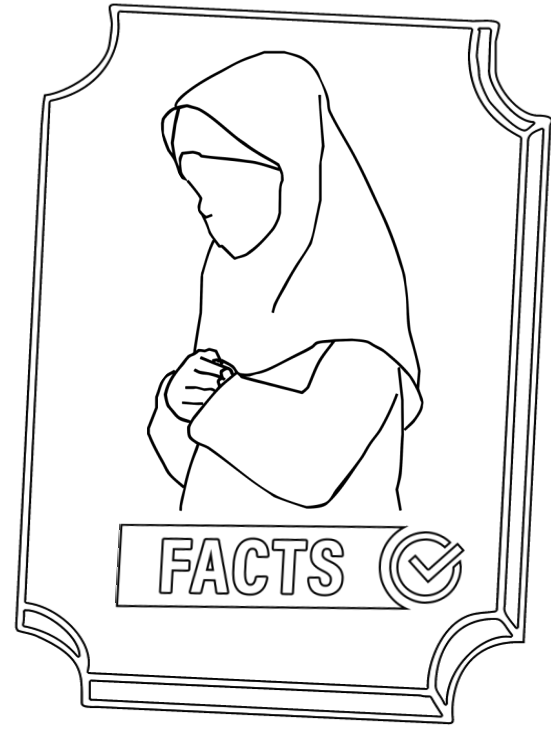
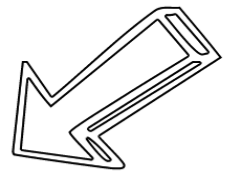
Salah is the most important form of worship. All the prophets of Allah were commanded to perform Salah.

We should be punctual and regular.

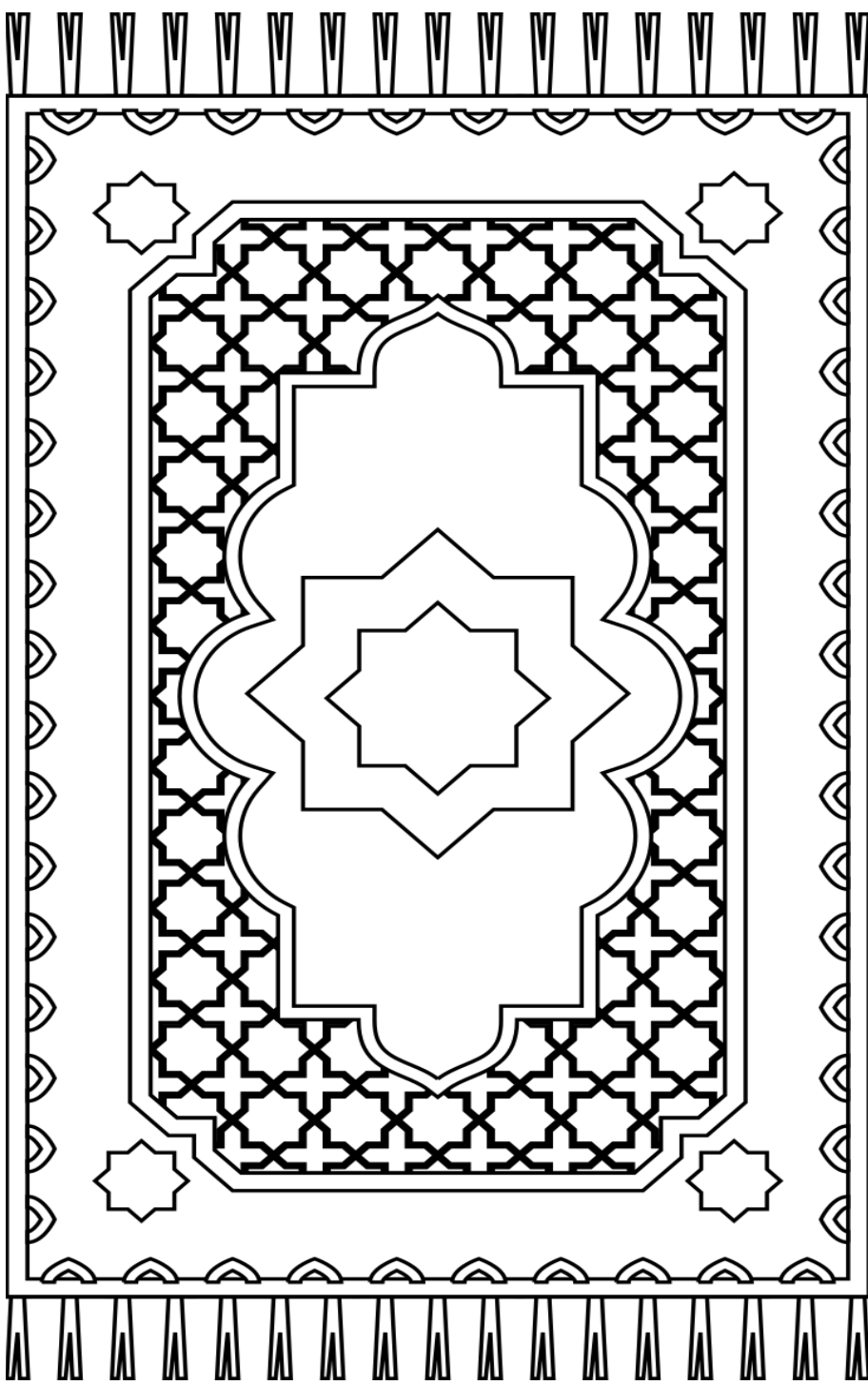
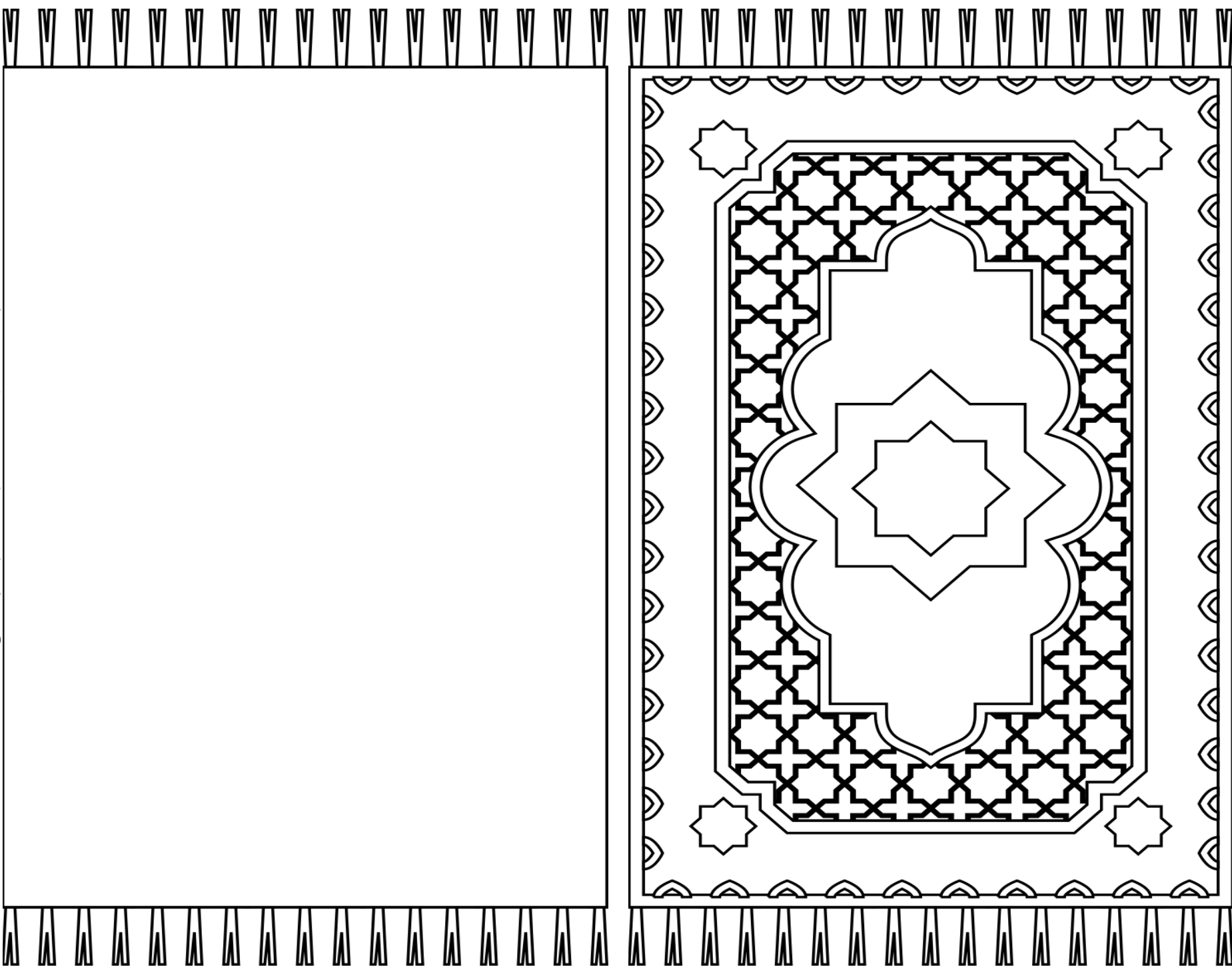

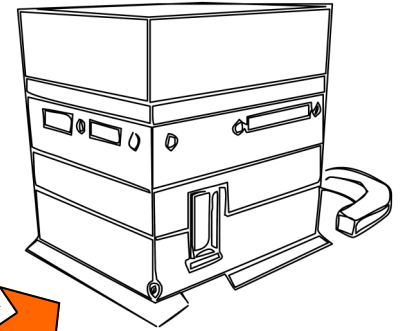
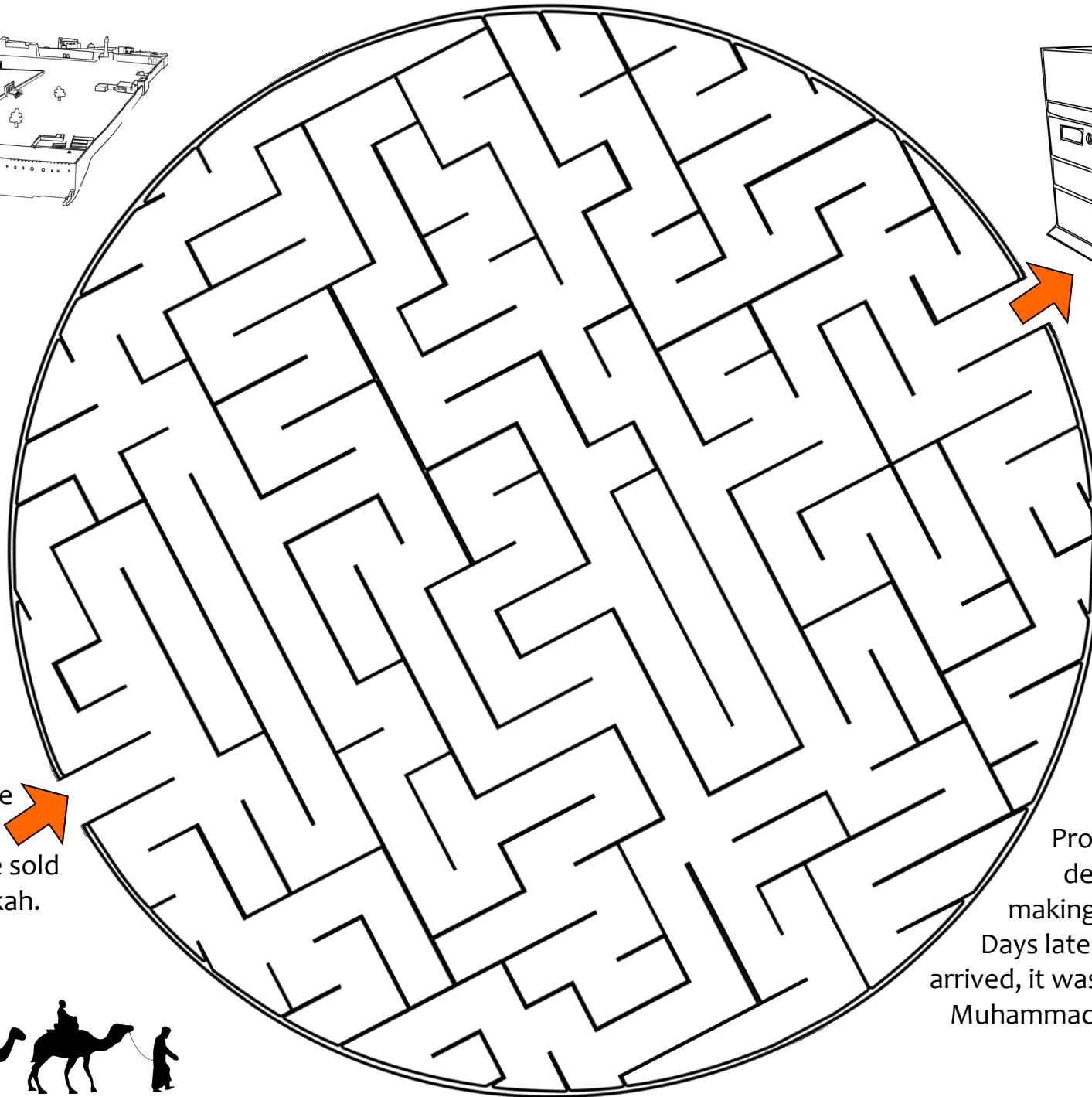
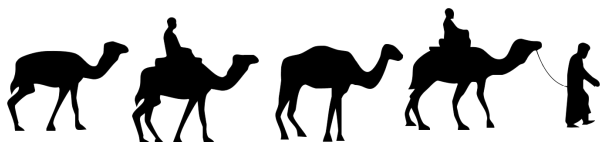




FROM JERUSALEM

On the return journey, he saw the caravans making their way through the desert. The camels were carrying their goods, later to be sold in the markets of Makkah.



TO MAKKAH

In Makkah, Prophet Muhammad ﷺ told the people about this amazing journey (Al-Isra).

Prophet Muhammad ﷺ described the caravan making its way to Makkah. Days later, when the caravan arrived, it was exactly as Prophet Muhammad ﷺ had described it.



The Night Journey

Prophet Muhammad ﷺ was sleeping in Makkah, not too far from the sacred Ka’bah. He was woken up by Angel Jibrael ﷺ.

Angel Jibrael ﷺ asked our Prophet Muhammad ﷺ to go on a special night journey. I know you might think a trip in the desert sounds fun. This was no ordinary journey.

Prophet Muhammad ﷺ mounted Buraq, which is an animal from Jannah. The best way to describe Buraq is that it’s like a white horse but smaller. As you know, Jannah is amazing, and so are the things inside.

Buraq could travel so fast, faster than anything on earth. With one single step, it travelled further than the eye can see.

Soon, Prophet Muhammad ﷺ was on his way with angel Jibrael ﷺ. They travelled from one sacred place, Makkah, to another sacred place, Masjid Al-Aqsa in Jerusalem (Al-Quds).

A journey that would take weeks was completed in a few seconds, if not less. It must have been very exciting. Prophet Muhammad ﷺ arrived in Jerusalem in Masjid Al-Aqsa.

They were all the prophets from the beginning of time.

A call for prayer was made, and the prophets lined up to pray salah. Then our Prophet Muhammad ﷺ led the salah with all the prophets praying behind him.

This was the first part of the amazing journey. The second part was when the Prophet Muhammad ﷺ was taken up to the heavens.

Prophet Muhammad ﷺ was also given the five daily prayers during this epic journey.

Prophet Muhammad ﷺ also toured Jannah and Jahannam, where he could see how people there were treated.

After returning back to Masjid Al-Aqsa, Prophet Muhammad ﷺ made the final journey back to Makkah, on the Buraq.
