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Allah Our Creator

Allah is our Creator and He knows what is best for us, therefore we are not allowed to disobey Him.

The Quran and Sunnah teach us that marriage is between man and woman only, so that we can find comfort in one another, and to produce more children for the Ummah of the Prophet Muhammad (saw).

Types of Homes

Some families in our society have two moms or two dads instead of one mom and one dad. This type of relationship is displeasing to Allah swt. This is known as homosexuality and in Islam it is considered Haraam.

People in the past, such as the people of Prophet Lut (as) used to practice homosexuality and were punished for doing so. Allah wants us to marry someone from the opposite gender, not the same gender.

Two Genders Only

Allah, our Creator, knows best what gender He decided for us when creating us.

If Allah created a girl, they *are not and cannot* be a boy, and if Allah created a boy, they *are not and cannot* be a girl.

In Islam, we are not allowed to identify as the opposite gender nor are we allowed to dress like someone from the opposite gender.

How to Present our Beliefs

We should present our beliefs of following the commands of our Creator while maintaining respect, avoiding fighting, and not putting anyone down.

This is because as Muslims, we dislike the sin and not the sinner, and desire for everyone to be guided towards the truth.
