Directions

- 1. Print (better to do so at local copy/print centre insha'Allah).**
- 2. Cut out the picture cards that are on page 4 insha'Allah.**
- 3. Laminate insha'Allah pages 1-3 insha'Allah and the individual picture cards.**
- 4. Cut out the laminated picture cards insha'Allah.**
- 5. Talk with your child about the types of activities Muslims do during the month of Ramadan. Identify what each picture represents insha'Allah. Read the words and/or short sentences under each picture insha'Allah.**
- 6. Invite your child to match the picture cards with the pictures on the work mats insha'Allah.**

- If your child begins to discuss what is happening in the picture (or tell a story), do not interrupt. When he/she appears to be finished, say “Jazakum Allahu khayr. Now let’s see what other things we do in Ramadan insha’allah and gently redirect the child’s attention back to where you left off.

- Depending on your child’s age and ability, present one mat at a time insha’Allah and as your child’s skill and ability increases make the other mats available insha’Allah (be sure to discuss what each picture shows on a new mat when you introduce it insha’Allah).
